A person-centred approach

The Cedars Care home is registered with the Care Quality Commission to care for adults who experience dementia and other mental health difficulties. The home has been supporting and caring for many local people and their families, as well as those further afield, since 1981.

We strongly believe that experiencing dementia is not the end of a fulfilling and active life, and this is why we place such importance in getting to know every new resident in-depth (their preferences, likes and dislikes).

Our person-centred care approach means that, as much as possible, the person can continue to live life on their own terms and be content in doing so.

Emphasis is placed on developing oneto-one relationships with our residents and providing a main key-worker for each person and their family, so as to establish a meaningful relationship. We also organise regular social events, individual and group activities. Residents are also encouraged to personalise their rooms in whatever way they prefer. It's all about making our residents feel at home.

It is our constant aim at The Cedars to provide a service which meets the highest standards. We recognise that this can only be achieved by recruiting and supporting the very best staff and providing continuous training and development. This investment ensures we have committed carers and support staff who are knowledgeable and skilled in our specific areas of care.

With our residential care services, you're in control

From accommodation and meals to personal care, our services include help with everyday tasks like getting up, going to bed, meal-times, washing, dressing, personal care, or taking medication.

Residential care

Our residential care offer gives you both the space and independence to be yourself as well as all the care and support you need to maintain a full and rich life. We develop individual care plans based on personal preferences and encourage feedback from residents and relatives so we can continually improve our practices.

As well as accomodation, meals and support with personal care and everyday tasks, other services can be provided such as hairdressing and podiatry and these will be charged for accordingly.

Costs

In relation to our fees for residential care, these can vary depending on the degree of care required and the type of room chosen, so please contact the Registered Manager who will be able to supply the relevant information personalised to your needs.



What's on offer at The Cedars Care Home?

Our trained staff provide 24-hour support for all aspects of personal care and use each daily activity, for example, dressing, mealtimes and recreation as an important source of engagement.

In the home we have a number of different communal lounges where residents can relax and welcome visitors. We also have an internal courtyard area which is an additional relaxation space.

Our social activities co-ordinator provides a weekly schedule of social events for residents to attend as well as one-to-one activities for those who prefer quieter engagement. This may involve music, artwork, baking, gardening or going to the local shops or having a drink at a café or pub. We are fortunate to have The Boundary House pub and restaurant on our doorstep as well as the local cricket and bowls club, plus ample recreation and garden space at The Cedars itself. Residents really value getting outdoors if they so wish.

We administer medications as required as well as offer a full laundry service.

Respite Care & Holiday Stays

Short-term care, even for as little as one or two weeks can be used for carers to take a break, go on holiday or if they're ill themselves.

Our respite care allows both parties to benefit from a change of scenery and gives carers the reassurance of knowing their loved ones are in safe hands.

It gives carers the perfect opportunity to take some time for themselves and to regain some balance. Respite care breaks can also be used for convalescence following hospital treatment to aid recovery or even as a little holiday break for you away from your usual surroundings.



Life at The Cedars

A home from home in a leafy village

Located in the suburb of Methley, south-east from Leeds City Centre The Cedars is located in expansive beautifully landscaped grounds. A quiet residential area Methley has a lovely village atmosphere, and The Cedars is a key part of the community.

The composer Edward Elgar was friends with the former owner (Mr. Embleton) of 'The Cedars' and often stayed at The Cedars.

To assist with the continuity of care we have our own local GP practice and pharmacy, both of which provide an excellent service to The Cedars. In addition, the village has an active cricket, football and rugby club, lots of local activity and the parish church Saint Oswald's (just across the road) is a 12th century Grade I listed building.





Shopping and eating out

We have a local post office, mini-market, and two lovely pubs – The Boundary House (which is close to The Cedars) and The Commercial in the village itself.

St Aidans Nature Reserve is also only a short distance away.

Enjoy a fulfilling social life

As a resident, you can look forward to a great programme of social club activities including keep fit, singing, whist, handicrafts and discussion groups, plus visits to museums, art galleries and theatres. You can get involved in as much or as little as you like.

Are the rooms and apartments spacious, light and clean? Is there a nurse call button in the rooms?

Facilities and equipment

Consider such things as: Is there a lift? Are there handrails on the stairs and access to equipment such as hoists and walking aids?

The staff

Are the people you meet friendly and helpful? What qualifications do the staff have? How many people are on duty at any one moment?

Mealtimes

Are meals prepared on site? Does the chef use fresh or processed ingredients? Can the facility cater for special diets?

The lifestyle

Is there a dedicated programme of events, entertainment, activities and outings? How are personal religious beliefs supported and respected?

Values

Are residents and relatives encouraged to express their views and provide feedback on services and care, as well as ideas and suggestions?

Cost

Are there any hidden fees or administration costs above and beyond the ones discussed?
